I wanted to drop you a line concerning our upcoming Pennsylvania Mission Trip set for August 12th through the 19th. As the details are coming clear and the cost has been noted, I wanted to reassure each of you that if God has placed this mission trip on your heart, then I would encourage you to step out in faith and commit.

Some have said, "I want to go, but I am not sure I can afford the cost." My response has been and will continue to be, "Share the need and trust the Lord!" Meaning tell others

what God has convicted you to do and allow the Lord to work in their hearts about possibly assisting you in this matter. You see, I believe if He has led you to the decision to follow Him on this mission trip, then He has already provided a way for it to happen. All we have to do is to wait and watch how He brings it to pass.

To help facilitate the collection of funding for our mission trip the association has set up an account so that anyone within the association or outside the association can contribute to this cause. Again, meaning even if you haven't felt led to go on this trip but would like to contribute in order to scholarship those going, you may do so.

God blessed our trip and our step of faith.

There has been a deadline to register of May 15th with a deposit of \$200.00. This cost will help us make the needed reservations, especially for lodging. The remainder of the cost would need to be gathered prior to August 12th. As noted on our current advertising, we have estimated that if one wants to fly, the cost for the entire trip, including round trip plane tickets, lodging, food, fuel for the vans, and misc. expenses, would be approximately \$1,220.00 (the cost of the plane tickets would need to be available by May 15th – If you have additional questions about this aspect of the trip please call).

If, however, you would wish to drive or travel in the vans provided, the total cost, less the plane ticket, would be approximately \$750.00. Given the cost of everything these days, these prices are very reasonable and in God's economy very doable.

Finally, I wanted to leave you with a great testimony of how God provided for one of our churches who made this trip last year and how God provided: "Last year Turkey Creek Baptist took a mission trip to Towanda, PA. We took 6 people and the initial cost was approximately \$750.00 each. Once the team members committed to take a step of faith, we began praying about the trip and the finances. God started supplying our needs from within the church and from outside sources. By the time we left for PA the cost for the trip, per person, was only \$28.00 each. God blessed our trip and our step of faith. I would encourage everyone to prayerfully consider taking a step of faith and move forward with the Lord. The Apostle Paul said, 'And my God shall supply all your needs according to His riches in glory by Christ Jesus.' (Philippians 4:19)." Pastor Shannon Owen – Turkey Creek Baptist Church.



From Zimbabwe: Evangelist Ruth was up early and went to the shopping center to evangelize The amazing thing is that each and every one she met - their hearts desire was to get a Bible for church, Bible school, and to own one for their family. This was a God moment. All of them asked for the name of your ministry and they said they will be praying for Love Packages every day. It's never been heard of in Zimbabwe, to get a Bible for Free, No! They were the happiest people. Some had been going to church but they did not own a Bible. There was one whole family going to church and they all got Bibles. They were like "What there is such a thing as a Children's Bible? Wow!" When they left, they were all singing, "What a friend we have in Jesus."

From South Africa: Yesterday was a very long day. I was awake from 3am and on my feet all morning sorting through, categorizing, and carrying tons of Bibles and books. My muscles were aching by the end of the day. Literature PT can give one a good all-over workout! The Bible can stretch our minds and muscles. Thank you to all those involved in providing this spiritual ammunition and for those volunteers who helped us offload and sort through these tons of treasures! The gate bell has been ringing all morning as pastors, policemen, teachers, evangelists, chaplains, and missionaries arrived to collect supplies for their ministries and outreaches.

From Kenya: The Sunday school materials have greatly improved our numbers in two ways. The little token/ items in the packages given to the children have acted as a great motivation for the kids to come to church. The teaching materials given to the Sunday school teachers have given them things to teach in a systematic manner. Previously the teachers would teach them whatever was convenient to them and in a manner that is not consistent.

From Uganda: We have conducted community gospel outreaches around Kampala in the last couple of weeks and thousands of people have given their lives to Christ. I therefore kindly request that you include more than 200 boxes of John and Romans booklets because they are very instrumental in evangelism. I also request that you may include more NKJV Bibles in the next shipment. This is because that version is preferred more than others and it's user friendly to new converts. We are also reaching out to the refugee camps in northern and western Uganda. Uganda is known to be Africa's largest refugee hosting country with over 2 million refugees. Most of these refugees come from the war troubled surrounding countries like Somalia, Ethiopia, South Sudan, Democratic Republic of Congo, Rwanda, Burundi, etc. And most of these refugees are open to the gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ. Therefore, we are working with a number of evangelical organizations to see that we reach them. And the best approach to leave an everlasting impact of the gospel of Jesus Christ in their lives is through Christian literature. This is one reason why the ministry of Love Packages is making a great impact here.



Let's Stop the Hurting: A Faith Response to Elder Abuse

We all deserve to live free from abuse. Yet older adults, especially those who are frail, are mistreated more often than we could imagine.

The National Center on Elder Abuse estimates that five million, or one in 10, older adults in America experience abuse, neglect, or exploitation. According to the US Department of Justice, only one in 20 cases of physical abuse and only one in 44 cases



need out help.

Numbers are shocking, but actual suffering is worse.

Numbers are shocking, but actual suffering is worse. It may be hard to imagine: bruises, slap marks, or broken bones at the hands of a "loved" one; being raped with no one to protect; seeing a frail, elderly person living in filth with little to eat and no medical care; or having money stolen and wills changed by a family member. These victims of elder abuse often suffer alone and in silence.

But, together we can stop the hurting! To develop our response to elder abuse, NCBAM consulted with pastors, Department of Social Services' Adult Protective Services (APS) staff, and senior leaders across the state. We were encouraged to move forward with a ministry to help those suffering.

Note that while North Carolina mandates responsibility to its Department of Social Services to receive, screen, and evaluate reports of abuse, the State provides little or no money for prevention or protection services.

NCBAM's response, "Let's Stop the Hurting: A Faith Response to Elder Abuse," can make a difference in the lives of many! NCBAM's regional directors are available to present an informative workshop to your group or congregation. You'll learn the types and warning signs of elder abuse, the role of APS, and most importantly - meaningful ways your church can prevent abuse.



'Gospel Hooks' Turn Everyday Conversations Toward Jesus

Sharing the gospel in Central Asia is rarely easy, but daily conversations often hold possibilities for getting started. International Mission Board missionary Josh Oakes knows all about it because he is there, living and serving among the region's lost. His calling includes taking advantage of each and every opportunity. He doesn't want to miss a single one. The power of the gospel to transform lives is his motivation – even if it takes years.

So Josh looks for ways to bring that powerful message into daily encounters. He calls these "gospel hooks." Small talk about the weather? Josh introduces God as the creator and sustainer of life. A comment about politics? Josh sees an open door



to talk about the mistakes people make and our for a Savior. Turning quickly to deeper topics, he listens to discern whether someone is searching for truth or closed and uninterested. In this way, he uses the gospel as a filter to determine where God is working in people's hearts.

Gospel hooks vary depending on cultures. Missionaries you support live and serve among the lost. They learn the culture and develop long-term relationships with the people. This steadfast presence leads to an understanding of how the gospel can best be shared to a particular people group.

"Different people think about anthropology or factors like age or gender as whether or not this person is going to be interested in the gospel. What we have found is what Paul tells us in <u>2 Cor. 2:15-17</u> is the best approach," Josh says. "We want to smell like God, be the aroma of Christ to everyone. For those we smell like life to, then they are going to want to be around us more. When we smell like death, they are going to distance themselves."

Toward the end of the pandemic, Josh's readiness to seize opportunities using gospel hooks started a spiritual conversation with a man named "Good News." Names provide a great opportunity in Central Asia for launching into deeper topics, because they usually have special meaning. Josh began by telling the man "gospel" translates to good news — the term Christians use for salvation that Jesus offers through His death and resurrection. Meanwhile, two more men walked into the room. The first man's name was Abraham, and the second man's name meant "salvation."

Yes, really. And Josh saw the divine humor in the meeting. "I laughed and told them that it seemed like God was wanting me to share something very important with all of them," he says. The men seemed interested, so Josh explained the meaning of their names. Their names reminded him of this good news: A descendant of Abraham came to earth and provided salvation for the world by giving His life as a sacrifice for sin.

At just that moment, a man named Hussein walked in the door. "I froze and told the other men in the room that Hussein was an Arabic name, so I didn't know what it meant. They laughed and said they didn't know if it connected with the message I was sharing with them or not," Josh remembers. Hussein looked confused, but then he turned to the man named Good News and said that he had come to this office because Isa (the Arabic rendering of "Jesus" and a common name in Central Asia) had sent him. "The men in the room then all looked at me surprised. Isa had told Hussein to go to the office of 'Good News' to ask a question while Abraham and 'Salvation' were there hearing the gospel!" Josh explains.

While none of the men immediately responded to the gospel message, Josh believes God orchestrated these events. He made a way for the gospel to be accessible and clear to people who are lost without Him.

"Five men heard the gospel that day, and one of them asked if we could exchange phone numbers. Praise the Lord!" Josh says. Leading a team in evangelism and church planting, Josh encourages his co-workers to be ready at any moment for opportunities to talk about Jesus. He says the more they speak of Him, the more readily they will be able to discern where to invest in deeper relationships.

"Time is our most valuable resource, so we want to be intentional to engage in these spiritual conversations." Will you take the transforming power of the gospel to the world's lost? Wherever you are in life, IMB has opportunities for you to serve.

One of the first ways our children learn that they are loved is when their cottage parents serve them the regular meals they were unable to count on before arriving. This is because their families let them down. When a child can't depend on loved ones to meet his or her basic needs, trusting any adult becomes almost impossible.

How does the Food Roundup help?

When your church, along with NC Baptists across the state, collect food, supplies and gift cards through the Food Roundup, you ensure that we can provide three meals a day plus snacks to our boys and girls and everyone we serve. Children's trust is restored! **Boys and girls see that they are loved not only by churches and caregivers but by a Heavenly Father our efforts point them too.**

By filling their plates, you fill their hearts.
